A Cat Called Jam was written and directed by Lorraine Lordan, and produced by Jeremy Purcell. It features the voices of Amy Huberman, Evan Lordan, Owen Rowe, Caoimhe Ní Bhradaigh, Sophie and Emma Deasy and Lorraine Lordan.

Lorraine is a veteran of the animation industry spanning many years and projects. She has been Animation Director on titles such as the Puffin Rock TV Series and The Breadwinner Feature Film. A Cat Called Jam is her directorial debut. Jeremy has been working in the animation industry for almost 20 years, starting out in 1999 working for the then fledgling Cartoon Saloon before starting his own studio, A Man & Ink, with Lorraine Lordan. He has returned to Cartoon Saloon, working on feature films and TV series.



Beyond The Circular Line Luke McManus

Beyond The Circular Line was originally commissioned by Waterways Ireland for Culture Night. It was Directed & Edited By Luke McManus; Image By Patrick Jordan; Music by Mount Alaska with Sarah Lynch; Picture Grade by Michael Higgins.

Luke McManus is an award-winning documentary maker who has worked on five continents making films for NBC, Channel 4, ITV, RTÉ, TV3, Virgin Media Television and TG4, winning three IFTAs, a Celtic Media Award, the Radharc Prize and an EBU Connect Award in the process. He has also directed drama and commercials, and is a producer, his most recent production credit being the acclaimed feature documentary The Lonely Battle Of Thomas Reid which premiered in the Main Competition at IDFA. Screened at HotDocs and Sheffield Doc/Fest, it won Best Film at the Dublin International Film Festival.



Ulysses | Film Alan Gilsenan

Alan Gilsenan's Ulysses | Film was specially commissioned by MoLl. Alan Gilsenan is an Irish writer, filmmaker and theatre director. His most recent work include the cinema documentary Meetings with Ivor, the feature film Unless, based on a novel by Carol Shields and The Meeting, which he wrote and directed and premiered at the 2018 Dublin Film Festival.

Gilsenan is a former chairperson of the Irish Film Institute. He also served on the Irish Film Board, and on the board of the International Dance Festival Ireland. Between 2009 and 2014, Gilsenan served on the board of Raidió Teilifís Éireann, where he chaired the Editorial and Creative Output Committee.

He is currently on the Board of Fighting Words, a creative writing centre for young people founded by Sean Love and novelist Roddy Dovle.



The Poetry Project Various artists

Originally commissioned as part of the Culture Programme of Ireland's EU Presidency in 2013.

The Poetry Project paired contemporary Irish poetry with videos by contemporary Irish artists. Words at Wilton Park presents a welcome chance to revisit some favourites. The Project was viewed over the course of the Presidency by people in more than one hundred countries.

Canal WaterAnthony Woods to a text by Colm Tóibín

Let Me Come Inland AlwaysBy Mary Lavin. Performed by Cathy Belton

This pair of short films, both commissioned by IPUT Real Estate are beautiful evocations of a sense of place in Ireland, of the Canal itself, and of those inland places where time flows gently on.

Multi award winning writer Colm Tóibín is one of the best known names in Irish literature. A novelist, short story writer, essayist, playwright, journalist, critic and poet, he is also an educator, and was called "a champion of minorities" by then Arts Council Director, Mary Cloake.

Anthony Woods is a much sought after photographer and videographer, based in Dublin. His film Canal Water is an IPUT Real Estate commission, to mark the occasion of Words at Wilton Park.

Mary Lavin is now regarded as a pioneer in the field of Irish Writing. Living for many years at Lad Lane, she won many awards for her novels and short stories. In 2021, Mary Lavin Place at Wilton Park was named in her honour. Born in Galway, leading actress Cathy Belton has appeared on stage, screen, radio and television, including in Red Rock, Intermission and as Norah in Hidden Assets.



Something in the water Various artists

'Something in the Water' commissioned by IPUT Real Estate Dublin, is the first exhibition at Wilton Park to use Ireland's largest outdoor LED installation dedicated solely to the arts as a piece of cultural infrastructure. Measuring 24.5-metres, the digital art installation offers a whole new platform for artists to connect with the city and a never-before-seen opportunity for Dubliners to immerse themselves in the world of digital art. The exhibition, curated by Algorithm and Louisa Carroll, features work by leading artists: Roman Hill, Ross Ryder, Kev Freeney, Cian McKenna, Carol Freeman - Paper Panther, Cormac Murray, Anna Lawlor, Sergey Maslov and the exhibition identity by Bureau Bonanza.
